Taped AA Talks Now Available From GSO

Twenty-three talks recorded on tape by AA members can now be bought from the General Service Office. They are talks of the "pitch," "lead," or "my story" kind, which "disclose in a general way what we used to be like, what happened, and what we are like now."

Each 5-inch reel contains two or three talks, and takes about one hour to play. They sell for \$2.50 each, and a list of the titles can be obtained by writing GSO., P.O. Box 459, Grand Central Station, New York 17, N. Y.

Included are stories collected by AA tape enthusiasts from all over the U.S.A., most of them actually recorded at AA meetings, conferences, and conventions. Each talk has been edited to preserve anonymity, and the necessary legal permission of each of the speakers has been obtained, so they can also be used for radio shows and public meetings arranged by AA Public Information committees.

Also available is a list of thirty-seven AA tape collectors willing to arrange exchanges, rentals, or sales of talks made in the U.S.A., Africa, England, New Zealand, New Guinea, Mexico, Colombia, Ireland, and Canada.
